THE PRIME MINISTERS

The Prime Ministers is the thirteenth production of the Simon Wiesenthal Center's two-time Academy Award-winning Moriah Films, a documentary film by Richard Trank and produced by Rabbi Marvin Hier. The film is a history of Israel from its beginning to the early 21st Century and is based on the bestselling book by Ambassador Yehuda Avner. Yehuda Avner narrates.



The pictures are remarkable; the history is, of course, remarkable. The documentary goes inside the offices of Israel's Prime Ministers, where we learn about some events that, perhaps, we had never really known before. Starring as the voices of these grand personalities are Leonard Nimoy as Levi Eshkol, Sandra Bullock as Golda Meir, Michael Douglas as Yitzhak Rabin, and Christoph Waltz as Menachem Begin.

The effects of Presidents Johnson, Nixon, Ford, Carter, and Truman had on Israel are

brought to light. Harry Truman was most instrumental in Israel becoming a nation unto itself.

This documentary is not only extremely interesting, but educational as well and I highly recommend it. It opens at The Royal in Los Angeles and Town Center in Encino on November 6, with a national release to follow. Running time is 115 minutes.
